Update from the Operations & Finance Manager

Kia ora

Thank you all for your support this year. **It is so good to have great volunteers** who work with the team in the office. I don't want to name anybody as I am afraid I miss someone, but please be assured that I appreciate your time, commitment, energy and support that we have received in many ways.

Despite being blessed with a big number of volunteers, we are still calling for new volunteers. For some tasks we still haven't found any volunteers, and then there are tasks that are better shared within teams of parishioners. Being part of a team working together means that they can support each other and being able to take a break without feeling that they are letting the parish down. As it says in the wisdom literature: "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labour: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up." (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10). If you have limited time to offer or specific talents you would like to share with the parish, please get in touch with me and we will find something that would suit you.

You will see that we have completed a number of **maintenance projects** this year. We are still in catch-up mode after the big dent that Covid left in the parish finances. At the same time, the churches and the presbytery are getting older: St Francis church was built in 1977 and St John's church in 1994.

We all know that maintenance hasn't become cheaper—as much as we are trying to save money by managing the projects ourselves and calling on some specialist volunteers who are carrying out repairs as well as other parishioners with trading businesses who give us preferred service when we call in emergencies.



Sometimes, I feel like key devices seem to break down when you most need them. Even though we had prepared quotes and calculated costs for new screens, we didn't think that we had to replace the projectors in an emergency act: the projectors in St John's church stopped working in Advent 2024 and the ones in St Francis church just before Holy Week 2025.

It is quite a challenge to get these kind of urgent projects done under enormous time pressure, but I would like to thank the volunteers who supported me and our wonderful parish electricians who went out of their way to get things done on time.

Enjoy this **Frankie & Johnny**—some snapshots of what has happened in 2025.






Baptism Preparation

Our Baptism Preparation Course offers families a calm space to pause from daily busyness, reflect on the meaning and origins of Baptism, and explore the Church's teaching alongside their role as parents and first educators. Through discussion, shared memories, and practical guidance, families connect with one another and grow in confidence as they prepare their child for this sacrament.

It has been a joy to accompany these families this year—listening to their faith stories, walking alongside them as they build relationships, and supporting them as they bring their children into the life of the Church. We are deeply grateful to the priests and deacons who have received these children into the Body of Christ, and to the many families who have embraced this grace for their children. May our parish continue to nurture them in faith as they grow and follow Jesus Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life (Jn 14:6).

OCIA – Becoming Catholic

Each week, families and adults preparing to enter the Catholic Church gather to explore scripture, prayer, the sacraments, and Catholic social teaching—discovering faith in Jesus Christ as a joyful, communal journey. One candidate shared, “I’ve found a peace I hadn’t known before,” while another said, “This journey has helped me see God in everyday moments.”

A favourite practice for families has been the 3-2-1 Endurance Challenge, introduced by Fr. Alister Castillo (Luke 21:5-19):

- 3 minutes of quiet prayer with Jesus
- 2 acts of encouragement to others
- 1 duty or service done well and without fuss

Families have found this simple rhythm a powerful reminder that Jesus is always with us, guiding daily faithfulness one step at a time.

Our parish accompanies them with prayer, hospitality, service, witness, and catechesis. Recently, **13 catechumens celebrated the Rite of Acceptance, while 4 candidates continue their journey toward full communion.** In his Advent homily, Fr. Carlo reminded us that their “yes” to Jesus’ gentle invitation is a call for all of us to stay awake to what truly matters, and to keep saying yes to Christ who visits us daily—in creation, in others, and in the Blessed Sacrament. He also highlighted that their desire to enter the Church strengthens us all, reminding us that faith is a journey of transformation, renewed constantly and full of hope as we walk in the light of Jesus.

Please keep Abraham, Abiya, Ainee, Belva, Beatrice, Brilliano, Brooklyn, Carlos, Celeste, Clinton, Harry, Hannah, Liam, Matthew, Vicky, Wan Zhu, and Xander in your prayers. If you see them at Mass, welcome them warmly into our parish family.

Two candidates will be received into the Church in February, the rest at Easter. All catechumens continue toward receiving the gifts of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.
